Claiming Stewardship, Not Dominion



Then God said, “Let us make humans in our image, according to our likeness, and let them have dominion over the fish of the sea and over the birds of the air and over the cattle and over all the wild animals of the earth and over every creeping thing that creeps upon the earth.” *Genesis 1:26*

Scripture tells us that, from the very beginning, God made humanity to “have dominion” over Nature and all her creatures. It’s an unfortunate choice of phrase. Especially since the Industrial Revolution, those who value worldly wealth over treasure in heaven have argued that our God-given “dominion” over Creation justifies treating the Earth as a pile of resources to be exploited rather than the sacred masterpiece of the Creator who gives life to all, humanity included, and who probably doesn’t appreciate seeing his handiwork pillaged and polluted. Institutional religion has been slower than it should to push back against the abuse of Creation. As we’ve become more aware of the harm that industrialized nations are inflicting on the planet and those with whom we share it, however, people of faith across the globe are stepping up to protect, restore and celebrate the beauty of “this fragile Earth, our island home.”

September marks the Season of Creation, when congregations around the world focus their worship on love and care for the natural world. This year’s theme is “Peace with Creation,” and as we regather from our summer adventures, we’ll spend our Sundays exploring how Scripture calls us to reject notions of dominion and, instead, express our gratitude to our Creator by healing and carefully tending to the Earth and everything that lives upon it. Bishop +Carrie Schofield-Broadbent has granted us permission to use special liturgical resources developed specifically for the Season of Creation in our weekly worship. Throughout September and early October, we will consider how we may best serve as stewards of God’s bruised and battered but still beautiful Creation. On October 4th, we’ll celebrate the lovely creatures who share our world with a Blessing of the Animals to commemorate the Feast of St. Francis of Assisi.

In October, we’ll celebrate the feast of our patron, St. Luke, with a special musical worship service featuring the Mass written by our brilliant Music Director, Dr. Ildar Khannanov. We’ll also take up the stewardship of St. Luke’s and our annual pledge campaign. Stewardship involves the prayerful use and management of the church’s resources, financial and otherwise, to ensure that St. Luke’s will continue to thrive and serve the Eastport community for many years to come. In a time when so many things in our society seem broken or off-kilter, cheerfully sharing what we have with the church and each other is a way to affirm our commitment to a faithful, hopeful future. I look forward to spending this beautiful season with you.

Thank you for keeping your pledge payments up to date. It is much appreciated and helps us to pay our bills promptly.

Remember that there are multiple ways that you can make your pledge payment:

- Sending a personal check in the mail to the church or placing it, or cash, in the offering plate on Sunday.
- Setting up a recurring payment using your bank's automated bill payment feature. There is generally no fee attached, and the bank sends

a check to the church automatically with the frequency and amount you specify.

- Using Givelify online (<https://www.givelify.com/donate/st-lukes-church-annapolis-md-2j7wy5ODQ0MQ==/donation/amount>). You may set up a recurring gift to match your pledge amount and frequency. Please remember that Givelify charges us for each donation, so please consider adding an additional couple of dollars to your donation to help us defray this cost.
- Zelle through your bank account. The church email address for Zelle is finance@stlukeseastport.org.
- Sending your pledge directly to the church from your IRA thus reducing the taxable income from your required minimum distribution. You may want to discuss this method with your tax or financial advisor.

September 1st marks the first day of Creation Season, which in turn flows into Stewardship after October 4th. Within this season we are asked to turn our hearts and minds to our Creator and to His work on earth and in the heavens:

Almighty and everlasting God, you made the universe with all its marvelous order, its atoms, worlds, and galaxies, and the infinite complexity of living creatures: Grant that, as we probe the mysteries of your creation, we may come to know you more truly, and more surely fulfill our role in your eternal purpose; in the name of Jesus Christ our Lord. *Amen*.

So says the wonderful prayer For Knowledge of God's Creation in the Book of Common Prayer. One of the most astonishing things is that, from the humblest cell to the brightest star, we are all made of the same substance. One of the best parts of Creation Season is the Blessing of the Animals on October 4th! Bring your furry, feathery, scaly or fishy friend, or a favorite toy or memento to be blessed during this festive day, which celebrates St. Francis of Assisi and his special bond with animals and stewardship of our earthly gifts.

Nurturing and supporting one another as God loves us is stewardship too, and so we will participate in the Annapolis Pride Festival rescheduled to October 18th. Understanding Discernment of Ordained Vocation

Our faith teaches that all baptized persons are called to minister in Christ's name, and the church is responsible for helping its members understand, identify and fulfill the ministry to which each of them are called. Lay ministry is the foundation of the Episcopal Church's mission and takes many forms, from reading or serving at the altar on Sundays to community service and outreach. A very few church members are called to ordination to become deacons, priests or bishops. Those individuals enter into discernment under diocesan supervision. In the [Diocese of Maryland](#), that process includes the ["Discernment of Ordained Vocation," or DOV program](#). Candidates for ordination explore diaconal and priestly ministries. They participate in an internship assigned to a parish, under the supervision of a Rector, to experience parish life and ministry in a different context. At the end of the program, participants who feel called to become deacons or priests are interviewed by the Commission on Ministry and, if approved by the bishop, become postulants for Holy Orders. They go on to several years of theological education with the hope and expectation of serving God and the church as ordained clergy.

On September 14th, St. Luke's will welcome our new DOV intern, Caleb Briggs. Caleb will be with us through Christmas, participating in our community and exploring the shared life and ministry of our congregation. Please give him a warm St. Luke's welcome as he explores his call to ordained ministry.

Caleb Briggs graduated St. John's College in May of 2025 (BA) and has been working full time as an office assistant at St. Anne's Parish. He is currently taking a gap year to discern his call to the priesthood.

Caleb is the son of two Episcopal priests so in some ways this feels like joining the family business while in other ways it feels like taking a leap into the unknown. A New England native, Caleb has come to love his adopted home of Annapolis and is living happily with his fiancée, Magnolia, and her hedgehog, Bonks, in an apartment on Murray Hill. The couple regularly attend St. Anne's and are heavily involved in the acolyte ministry there.

Additionally, Caleb began a service of sung compline at 7 p.m. on Tuesdays and Thursdays at St. Anne's and has enjoyed growing this ministry. One call he has felt strongly throughout his discernment has been to create prayerful space. He is excited to continue to explore this call as well as many others at St. Luke's.
